Our August **outing** to Rault Biscuit Factory in Maheburg was followed by a delicious lunch at Falaise Rouge. 15 ladies attended and experienced the charm of the tiny, completely authentic, hand-made production line dating from 1870. We were shown how the cassava is grown, how it is cleaned and pressed, the resulting flour and then how it is mixed and turned into surprisingly tasty biscuits. We know how good they taste as after the factory tour we enjoyed tea and biscuit tasting. Many of us could not resist buying up a good stock to take home.

From the biscuit factory we continued along the coast to another historic site, the Falaise Rouge, to enjoy our lunch at the site of a former observation post used by the French army during the Great Battle of Grand Port. There is also an old French cannon on the site, which was used during this great battle and Solange kindly helped us get acquainted with the history behind the battle. Since we were there so close to the anniversary of the battle (20th August) she brought some flowers to throw into the sea to honour those who battled there.



A Charity Shop has been set up in CurePipe by Autisme Maurice to provide work for unemployed mothers of autistic children. Some mothers also received training to produce handicrafts for the shop but for now the shop is very short of things to sell and is seeking our help with donations of clothes and other items they can sell.
