At our **November Meeting** we had a team of three speakers from the African Leadership College in Pamplemousses led by Dr Stephen Naicken, Director of Academic Programmes, who explained to us the learning strategies they have developed to equip their graduates with the skills they will need to find a job: these include character building, mission driven learning and work experience. In their first year, students are helped by facilitators to develop critical thinking, to communicate for impact, to discover leadership skills. And to illustrate the type of problem solving students are given, we were divided into groups and gradually fed information about a company in Ghana struggling to sell its pineapples before reporting back with our suggested solutions. Finally, Jeremiah, a third-year student told us why he had chosen ALC and what he had learned during his time there. Overall, a most interesting and informative discovery of the work of ALC.




Thursday 24 October: Our visit to Ile aux Aigrettes under the auspices of the Mauritian Wildlife Foundation. Eleven intrepid Corona members met up at Pointe Jerome armed with sun cream, sun hats, sensible shoes, water and cameras ready to embark on the short boat trip to the island that has been a nature reserve since 1965 and on a long-term lease to MWF since 1987. Our very knowledgeable guide Melanie then took us on a walking tour. She pointed out the various endemic trees and plants: ebony, candlewood used for lighting by the early settlers, the blue latanier used to build their houses and thatch their roofs, a beautiful and delicately scented white orchid... We were introduced to Big Daddy aka the Playboy, the 110-year old giant tortoise, and later bumped into a pretty little endemic day gecko. We were very fortunate to see the pink pigeon who sat there contentedly while we all took photos as well as the beautiful Mauritian male fody and his smaller olive mate, and even the elusive tiny olive white eye. We then made our way to La Falaise Rouge for a very convivial Mauritian lunch before heading back north. All in all, a lovely day! (with thanks to Marie-Louise for her photos)



CORONA NORTH BOOK GROUP DATE FOR YOUR DIARY: **The next Book Group meetings** will be at 10.30 on **Monday 4 November** at Gail's Cafe, Grand Baie Gym to discuss **The Secret Diary of Hendrik Groen 83 3/4 Years Old by Hendrik Groen - or is it?** 

The Book Group met on Monday 7th October and there were just five of us this month. We discussed Paris Echo, the latest novel by Sebastian Faulks - a favourite author of mine and hence my choice! The book traces the experiences of two very different protagonists, whose contrasting worlds collide during their two separate stays in Paris over the same few months. Both are searching for evidence of the past: Tariq, a 19 year old of mixed 'pied noir'/Algerian/Moroccan who is on a personal quest to discover his late mother's early life - and himself! - while Hannah, a 30



something American academic is more specifically researching the lives of French women in Paris during the Second World War - as well as laying the ghosts of her stay in the city ten years before. Faulks also introduces several ghostly episodes - which we found somewhat baffling and not very successful. Two horrific historical events in the city are revealed in the process of their searches, while an insight into how people survive under occupation is also given. Altogether the group found the book interesting and thoughtprovoking if not a 'must-read'! It was great to share some of our own experiences of Paris 'this wonderful, difficult place' (Faulks) and we had fun too setting the world to rights! Two other quotes resonate with me: 'What haunted me was the sense that their secrets had left a permanent void in my life.' and Faulks views on patriotism, as conveyed in an interview about the book, 'I'm a patriot, to an extent. That's a very British answer, isn't it? I cheer the England football team like crazy, but am wary of Nigel Farage and that nonsense. I'm proud of British achievements in arts, science and discovery. But there will always be this slight reservation you won't find in France because the so-called elite believes France to be unique with a mission to teach the world. This is not what the British intellectual class thinks about Britain. I'm not in any way sneering at the French, but it is a profound difference.' (With thanks to Amanda Pike for her review).
